It's right on the tip of my tounge but I can't remember at the moment.

I'll get back to you though.

Ok,

I think I remember now.

Take the plate off the top of the bell

housing.

Start it up.

Watch where the fluid is pouring from.

Where ever its pouring from there is supposed to be a spray tube there.

If the tube is there then it turned and you'll have to repoint it, should be straight towards the the flywheel direction.

If you do have to repoint it you'll notice the time difference of the oil filling in the bell housing pointing it in thr right direction gives the fluid more time to pump out keeping the level low so it doesn't reach the starter.

If it is not there then take a magnet and see if it is laying in the bottom of the bell housing.

Hi Steve

Thanks for answer, but you thinking of different transmission. I had same problem with Hyster forklift model "E" I'm working on "F" model. This one does not have sp flows in through opening under the torque converter from transmission side. As the converter spins the fins are pushing oil into pickup tube and out to oil tank. That aluminum and flat 8.125" long and 1.125" wide bent shape of bell housing. Top of bell housing does have cover but its only 1"wide and 3" long, you can hardly see a because aluminum pickup tube adjustment is there (two bolts with owal holes) Hope this will give you new idea.

I've worked plenty of hysters but didn't do trans work on that tranny and I can't find any information on this truck so again I am going to have to go by memory.

I believe that truck runs the hydraulic pump by a chain and the oil lubes the chain,there was one that I thought may have been run from the flywheel.

One idea is that the hydraulic pumps front seal is leaking causing more fluid to be in there.

The other would be that the torgue converter has a crack and is leaking, the only thing with that is that it would effect movement.

I'm thinking front seal on the hyd pump.

Get back to me and let me know whats up.



Hydraulic pump is mounted on the engine front cover, bad pump seal would increase engine oil level, mine is normal. Here is picture of that pickup flat tube and t.cor from that tube goes straigt to oil tank and i get full flow, problem is in oil supply not discharge. Today I'll take trans. control valve a part hopping to find something there
